

# History of the Site

- City of Foley and Riviera Utilities purchased 484 acres of farmland from Mr. Faust in 2004 for \$5.66 million
- One of the intentions was a water supply from aquifer
- City maintained open fields and farm roads
- **2008** 
  - City and Riviera Utilities agreed to property usage as park with rights for Riviera Utilities to add water wells in future
  - Master Planning Grant received from ADCNR
  - Habitats Identified & Plant Inventory Conducted
  - Property Named Graham Creek Nature Preserve




