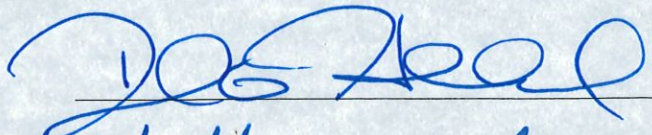


## **Proclamation**

- Whereas,** Lugenia Hall was elected as councilwoman to the City Council District 2 of the City of Foley in 1989; she was reelected in 1992 and;
- Whereas,** she was the first African-American woman elected to the City Council in Foley, Alabama, and;
- Whereas,** on December 18, 1989, Ms. Hall was appointed as the City Treasurer of Foley under Resolution 586-89 and;
- Whereas,** in her tenure as Councilwoman, the Holk Post Office Building located at 150 East Laurel Avenue in Foley was dedicated to Public Service in 1995. There is a dedication plaque mounted on the building that includes Lugenia Hall along with her fellow Councilmembers; the President of the United States William Clinton; the Postmaster General and Mayor Author Holk, and;
- Whereas,** Lugenia Hall was a hard worker throughout her whole life and often held multiple jobs to provide for her family and she has been likened to a diamond because time and pressure will refine the best, and;
- Whereas,** she will always stand as an example of the City of Foley's best, a pioneer, a selfless, hard worker who was dedicated to her family and her community, and
- Whereas,** on June 10, 2022, Lugenia Hall received a call, a sort of an offer she could not refuse, for an appointment from which she will not be returning. This assignment comes with a huge sign-on bonus, a reunion with family and friends she has not seen in a long time.

**Now, therefore,** I, Ralph Hellmich, Mayor of the City of Foley, Alabama, and on behalf of the City of Foley City Council, do hereby honor and recognize **Lugenia Hall** for her dedicated service to the City of Foley as District 2 Councilwoman. I also extend my sincere condolences to her family and friends.
