ORDINANCE NO. 1193-12

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE EXEMPTION OF CERTAIN COVERED ITEMS AS DEFINED IN ACT NO. 2006-574 FROM THE PAYMENT OF CITY SALES AND USE TAX FOR THE FIRST FULL WEEKEND IN AUGUST

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF FOLEY, ALABAMA, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: In conformity with the provisions of Act 2006-574 enacted by the Alabama Legislature during the 2006 Regular Session, providing for a State Sales Tax Holiday for the City of Foley, Alabama, exempts "covered items" from municipal sales and use tax during the same period, beginning at 12:01 a.m. on the first Friday in August (August 3, 2012) and ending at twelve midnight the following Sunday (August 5, 2012), and on the first full weekend of August each year thereafter until rescinded.

SECTION 2: This ordinance shall be subject to all terms, conditions, definitions, time periods, and rules as provided by Act 2006-574.

SECTION 3: The City of Foley and Tanger Outlet Center waives the .5% Project User Fee assessed on the transactions at Tanger for the weekend of the sales tax holiday, which will commences at 12:01 a.m. on Friday, August 3, 2012 and ends at twelve midnight on Sunday, August 5, 2012 and on the first full weekend of August each year thereafter until the Project User Fee agreement between Tanger and the City of Foley expires or otherwise terminates.

SECTION 4: The City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to certify a copy of this ordinance under the seal of the City of Foley, Alabama, and to forward said certified copy to the Alabama Department of Revenue to be recorded and posted on the Department website.

SECTION 5: This ordinance shall become effective on Tuesday, June 12, 2012.
