## Mayor's Comments

Mayor Hellmich announced that the Gulf Coast Hot Air Balloon Festival will be held at the OWA Festival Grounds on Thursday, April 30, 2026 and Friday, May 1, 2026 from 4:00pm to 9:30pm, and Saturday, May 2, 2026 from 10:00am to 9:30pm.

He also announced that the 2026 Music and a Movie series has returned, with upcoming dates of Friday, April 24, 2026, Friday, May 15, 2026, and Friday, May 22, 2026. He reported that each event will begin with a live concert at 6:00pm in the park pavilion, followed by a featured movie at dusk.

Mayor Hellmich reported that the City currently has several ongoing sidewalk projects at various stages of completion, including the Mills Sidewalk Project, the Azalea Ave. to Pride Blvd. Sidewalk Project, and the Cedar Street

**Sidewalk Project.**

He reported that there is an effort to seek congressional funding in FY 2027 for a Highway 59 third lane expansion heading South of Foley, but it is still in the preliminary stages.

He also reported that there are plans for several America 250 events throughout the City, and that he will provide details in the near future.

He reported that last month, tax revenue exceeded the City's budget, indicating a positive trend for sales tax receipts.

Mayor Hellmich reported that staff is currently researching audio-visual options for City Council Meetings as Council Member Tim Lower has requested. He reported that this process is taking longer than anticipated due to the addition of new ADA requirements, but that staff will present options to Council at a later date.

He reported that the new Public Works facility is nearing completion and that staff is preparing to move within the next week. He also reported that once Public Works has relocated, the City has plans for Parks and Recreation to move into the old Public Works building, followed by the current Parks and Recreation building being refurbished as a new event center and museum complex.

He also reported that the Foley Aquatics Center is still in the design phase, but that when construction begins it will be on property adjacent to the city pool, which will allow the pool to maintain its regular operating hours until construction is complete.

Mayor Hellmich also reported that construction on the safe room has begun, and expressed his hope that there is no disruption to the federal funding so the project can be completed in a timely manner.

**Visitor Comments**

Jay Springsteen, of Springsteen Lane addressed Council to express his concerns regarding a new subsidized apartment complex that will be built near his property. He reported that traffic in the area is an ongoing issue, and that he has concerns that an apartment complex will add to congestion, lower property values, and possibly increase crime.

Mayor Hellmich reported that he understands Mr. Springsteen's concerns, but that this subsidized apartment complex is unique in that it is part of a new bipartisan program that offers tax incentives to housing developers to provide affordable housing to first responders. He also reported that part of the requirements of this program include upgrades to roads, which would include an extension to the Foley Beach Express that should help with traffic.

**Adjournment**

unanimous vote.
