The City of Foley Police Department requested \$119,493, but was awarded \$90,105.00 towards this purchase. The VirTra training system was included in the FY24 capital purchase budget for \$130,000. Wynter Metz reported the Street Department has identified a ditch in need of being cleaned along the west side of Meadow Run Loop, due to erosion, debris, and sediment causing drainage blockages. The ditch is in need of re-grading, tree trimming, re-shaping and erosion control. GreenCo LLC has provided a quote to perform this work for \$128,843.50. The area targeted is the .5 mile of ditch that runs north from County Rd 12 parallel with Meadow Run Loop. The clearing of debris and sediment, as well as the re-shaping will protect residents private property as well as alleviate flooding issues.

Project Manager Jeff Phillips reported Kimley Horn submitted a Professional Services proposal in the amount of \$12,000.00 for the pedestrian crossing features at the signalized intersection of Highway 59 and Myrtle Avenue. The signal currently operates with Highway 59 as the mainline and provides a single phase for vehicular demand on the side-street (Myrtle Avenue). The signal is part of ALDOT's Regional Traffic Operations Program (RTOP) and operates as part of a coordinated signal system along Highway 59 throughout Baldwin County. The nearest signal is Highway 59 and Highway 98, approximately 800 fee to the north. The nearest signal to the south is Highway 59 and Azalea Avenue, approximately 1,750 feet away.
