SECTION 3: This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its adoption as required by law.





306A Public Access Improvement Grants



Funding is provided by the Office of Ocean and Coastal Resource Management (OCRM) of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) and administered by the ADCNR on a competitive basis. Thus, the timing of this request for project proposals is coincident with the development of the State's annual Application for Federal Assistance to NOAA to administer the Alabama Coastal Area Management Program (ACAMP). The applications will be reviewed by ADCNR/SLD Coastal Section staff. Assisting in the review will be the Mobile Bay Natural Estuary Program (MBNEP). This joint review is intended to support the ACAMP and the MBNEP Comprehensive Conservation Management Plan.

Section 306A - Public Access Improvement Grants are designed to assist states, area-wide agencies, regional agencies and local units of government to acquire, develop or improve public access to coastal areas. Eligible projects include new public access construction, repairs and/or renovation, land acquisition or environmental education in the form of interpretive signage.

Project proposals will be reviewed and funding will be prioritized based on 1) availability of federal funds, 2) the nature and scope of the project, and 3) formal grant approval by NOAA, OCRM.

If accepted, funds will be available October 1, 2012 for a period not to exceed 12 months or by request of the applicant 15 months.

Project applications are required to contain the following information:

- 1. Completed application with all required attachments (Attachments 1 and 2).
- 2. Project package that includes:
  - a. Name of project
  - Detailed task description
  - c. Detailed budget

- e. Site plan
- f. Electronic copy of project description and budget
- g. A title opinion, title insurance commitment/certificate, or affidavit showing that the property on which the proposed project will be located is publicly owned, leased, or under easement in perpetuity or for the expected life of the project (at least 20 years) will be required within 30 days of notification of project acceptance
- h. Other information may be required by the Coastal Section on an as-needed basis

#### **Funding Information:**

- All awards require a 1:1 ratio of <u>non-federal</u> matching funds. Match may consist of cash, materials, in-kind services or donations that support the project.
- Awarding of contracts will be subject to receipt of funds from NOAA.
- Funding is geographically limited to those sites located completely or partially within the Alabama Coastal Area (those lands and waters seaward of the continuous 10' contour in Mobile and Baldwin Counties).
- Funding will be administered through contractual arrangements administered by the State Lands Division.
- The preferred minimum funding amount is \$20,000.00 federal funds. Maximum funding amount is \$50,000.00 federal funds. Several projects from one unit of government or entity may be bundled to meet the minimum. Applications for funding less than the minimum will be accepted, but the applicant must provide justification and the proposal must meet a unique and/or critical need.

Therefore, once the ADCNR, State Lands Division, Coastal Section tentatively approves a project, the staff submits it to ADEM for a consistency review.

In some cases, ADEM will certify consistency before the contract with the applicant is executed, and this determination will be included in the contract that is executed between the ADCNR, SLD and the applicant. In other cases, the ADEM determination will take place after the contract is executed. If the project is not consistent, then the applicant may work with ADEM to make the modifications necessary to be consistent with the program. The applicant must submit to the Coastal Section office any resulting changes in the project and a copy of the ADEM certification of consistency prior to beginning work. If a project cannot come into compliance or if the applicant chooses not to alter the project, the project will not be eligible for funding.

#### Alabama Department of Conservation and Natural Resources

Once the ADCNR, State Lands Division, Coastal Section tentatively approves a project application, the staff submits it to the ADCNR Marine Resources Division and/or the Wildlife and Freshwater Fisheries Division for a determination as to whether or not the project will impact the fisheries resource. Staff will also review projects that involve state submerged lands. These determinations are provided in a letter to the Coastal Section office. Staff will contact the applicant if the state determines that the fisheries resource will be adversely impacted or if the State Lands Division requires further action.

- b. If the land ceases to be available (or the project ceases to be used) for the intended use at any time during the life of the project, the applicant must reimburse the state the full amount of the federal cost of the project, and the state, in turn, will reimburse NOAA.
