Executive Director of General Government Administration Cian Harrison reported that this resolution is a request for an amendment to the pay classification for the Marketing Director (210) be changed to a Communications Director (240), and establish a new Communications Department under the General Government and Administrative Division.

Mayor Hellmich reported that this Communications Department will coordinate communication across all departments to ensure a unified message across all platforms.

City Administrator Mike Thompson reported that during this change, certain responsibilities will be added to this position, and others will be reassigned to the more appropriate department.

Mayor's Comments

Mayor Hellmich reported that the government appropriation item was a grant for economic development and was passed by Senator Albritton to make infrastructure improvements, such as roads, sewer, and electricity.

He reported that the Gumbo Festival will be held on Saturday, January 31, 2026 and will be a two-day event.

He also reported that the MLK program was successful, and expressed thanks to the Public Safety Department and others who assisted with the event. He reported between 200 to 300 people were in attendance.

Mayor Hellmich reported there will be a Foley Education Advisory Committee meeting on Friday, January 30, 2026 at 9:00am, with a tour of Foley High School and Florence B. Mathis Elementary School immediately following.

He reported that the Library and Public Works campuses are moving along and they hope to be completed soon.

He reported that he recently addressed a group of 100 people at the Senior Citizen Center, and gave progress updates on the new facility. He also reported that Senior Center membership has grown to nearly 1700 members.

Fire Chief Joey Darby reported that a three-day Arts and Crafts Festival will be held this weekend at OWA.

Councilman Tim Lower reported that he and Councilman Roderick Burkle attended the Snowbird Coffee event at the Civic Center. He thanked City staff for their efforts in making the event successful.

Council President Wayne Trawick reported that a former council member requested the Council consider potential upgrades to Veterans Park.

Mayor Hellmich reported recent improvements made to Veterans Park, including the installation of Army guns, new flagpoles, and enhanced lighting. He also reported ongoing discussions regarding the addition of shade structures over park benches. Additionally, he reported upgrades to the World War II Memorial site, including the installation of an informational kiosk and a USS Alabama shell. He encouraged citizens with suggestions for improvements to parks honoring veterans to share their ideas.

Mayor Hellmich reported a significant reduction in temporary signage along the Highway 59/Highway 98 corridor following enforcement of the sign ordinance. He reported that he anticipates some public concerns, but he encouraged residents with constructive feedback to reach out.

Mayor Hellmich reported that the facade grant program could be an opportunity for the City to help alleviate these costs. He reported that in the budget for the next fiscal year, the Council could possibly designate it to be used for signs in the downtown historic district.

Visitor Comments

Executive Director of Infrastructure and Development Wayne Dyess reported that he will send the Council written materials to help them answer questions regarding this ordinance to their constituents.
