Mayor's Comments

Mayor Hellmich reported that the Arbor Day Celebration, held on Saturday, February 28, 2026, was well-attended and the weather was beautiful.

He reported that The Baldwin Times published an article about Captain Royce Williams, who flew in Foley's historic N3N aircraft and was recently awarded the Medal of Honor by President Trump during the State of the Union address.

Mayor Hellmich also reported that the March 2026 edition of Mobile Bay Magazine features an article about Foley's Wilbourne Antique Rose Trail, including quotes from Guy Busby, Brenda Shambo, and John Brown.

He also reported that the City of Foley is one of five cities in Alabama to have earned the Triple Crown Award for Accounting, and he extended his appreciation to Finance Director Miranda Bell and her staff for their diligent work.

He reported that Hearts for Heroes, the officer and first responders appreciation event held March 1, 2026 was successful, and expressed his gratitude to all first responders. He also thanked the committee who hosted the event.

Visitor Comments

Council Member Larry Engel reported that the archery tournament was held at Graham Creek Nature Preserve from February 19th through the 21st, hosting 2,000 archers, and he commended City staff for making the event a success.

Jerry Finney, owner of Dad's Roofing, located at 307 S. McKenzie Street, addressed Council to seek clarification regarding the Sign Ordinance. He reported that he has used temporary yard signs in the past to indicate the location of a jobsite to delivery drivers and his work crew. He also reported that he affixes the building permit number to the sign, so that the Home Builders Licensure Board can verify the building permit without stopping construction. He requested Council consider amending the Ordinance to allow for businesses to use these signs for no longer than 4 to 5 days at a time with the purchase of a permit.

Mayor Hellmich responded that this is a unique situation and referred the question to Executive Director of Infrastructure and Development Wayne Dyess, who reported that his department will research this issue.

Kathleen Borne, business owner at 515 N. McKenzie Street, addressed Council with her concerns regarding the certified letters that were sent to business owners in violation of the Sign Ordinance.

Mayor Hellmich reported that the City was following legal counsel throughout this process to ensure that situations are handled fairly and properly. He suggested that in the future, if any constituent has questions, to reach out to City staff for assistance.

Executive Director of Infrastructure and Development Wayne Dyess reported that letters, social media posts, and press releases were sent out beginning in October of 2025 notifying business owners of the upcoming enforcement of the Sign Ordinance so they would have time to prepare.

Mark Clifford, CEO of the Wacked Out Weiner, located at 215 E. Laurel Avenue addressed Council on behalf of small businesses in Foley regarding the Sign Ordinance. He requested that Council collaborate and compromise with small businesses due to the cost of purchasing compliant signage.

Council Member Charles Ebert, III, recommended that due to Mr. Clifford's business location in the historic district, he should consider contacting Darrelyn Dunmore with Foley Main Street and applying for a facade grant to cover the cost of a new sign.

Mayor Hellmich requested that Mr. Clifford and other local business owners reach out to the City with any suggestions or ideas they may have to address these Sign Ordinance concerns, and the City will take them into consideration.

Adam Green, owner of Custom Truck Accessories, located at 3420 S. McKenzie Street, addressed Council for clarification regarding the Sign Ordinance. He reported that he received a letter concerning his business name printed on the monster truck in front of his business, and he immediately put a cover on it to avoid a fine. He reported that the truck has been in that location for fifteen years without issue, and wanted to confirm that it was in violation before paying to have it rewrapped.

Mayor Hellmich requested that he exchange contact information with Executive Director of Infrastructure and Development Wayne Dyess to discuss a possible solution.

Terri Kotis, owner of TMAK Signs and Graphics, located at 1907 S. McKenzie Street, addressed Council to express her concerns regarding the enforcement of the Sign Ordinance. She reported that she received a notice letter concerning a boat that has been wrapped to advertise wrapping services for her business. She also reported that she attempted to comply by moving the boat 100 ft back from the road, but that she received an additional notice to relocate the boat back further. She asked Council for guidance on how to proceed.

Mayor Hellmich reported that this is a situation that might not be clearly defined in the Ordinance.

Ms. Kotis reported that she would contact Council Member Tim Lower and Executive Director of Infrastructure and Development after the Council Meeting for guidance in this specific situation.

Candace Jeans, owner of Kandie's Pampered Pooch Pet Grooming, located at 1917 S. McKenzie Street, addressed Council to express her concerns regarding the enforcement of the Sign Ordinance. She reported that she had a metal sign that was not in compliance, so she had it removed. She reported that without a sign, it makes visibility difficult due to a neighboring business obstructing the view of her storefront from the road.

Mayor Hellmich asked Planning Director Miriam Boone if a locator sign would be appropriate in cases where the view of a shopping center is obstructed, and she confirmed that it would.

Ms. Jeans and Ms. Kotis reported that the existing locator sign is in disrepair and a new sign would be cost prohibitive.

James Lundsted, of 7886 Calverton Street in the Primland Subdivision addressed Council to express his concerns regarding a foul odor at the intersection of County Road 12 and Wolf Bay Drive.

Mayor Hellmich reported that this has been an ongoing issue with the Orange Beach Sewer Authority lift station. He also reported that upon further investigation, it was discovered that a new pipeline and a new odor abatement system has been installed, which will hopefully correct the problem. Mayor Hellmich reported that the City will continue to monitor the situation.

Council Member Roderick Burkle reported that he also lives in the area and will continue to monitor the situation.

Luke Demay, owner of the Book Exchange, located at 101 W. Laurel Avenue, addressed Council to suggest a repeal of parts of the Sign Ordinance. He reported that it will be expensive for small businesses to buy new signs that are in compliance, and stated he believes the signs are attractive and helpful.

Jayne Bartshe, owner of The Brick Oven, located at 21040 A Mifflin Road, addressed Council to express her concerns regarding the enforcement of the Sign Ordinance. She reported a decrease in lunch sales following the removal of a marquee and pizza flags by the road.

Mayor Hellmich suggested that the Ordinance could be amended to permit the use of a sandwich board sign in front of the business, but said that the process could take approximately two months.

Stephanie Rhodes, owner of Agape Juices, located at 3782 S. McKenzie Street, addressed Council to share her concerns regarding the Sign Ordinance. She also expressed her support for the suggestion of amending the Ordinance to allow for sandwich board signs.

Mayor Hellmich reported that the City will look at making some common sense changes to the Ordinance to address some of these concerns.

Executive Director of Foley Main Street Darrelyn Dunmore reported that Foley Main Street will host workshops teaching business owners how to market their business, including alternative methods of marketing that are within the guidelines of the Sign Ordinance.

Grant Blackburn, candidate for Baldwin County District Court Judge, addressed Council to introduce himself to both Council and the community.

Adjournment

A motion was made by Council Member Roderick Burkle, seconded by Council Member Larry Engel, to adjourn the meeting. The motion carried by an unanimous vote.
