October is Domestic Violence Awareness Month, and I invite you to take part in our efforts to raise awareness, improve services and make Alabama communities safe for its families.

The Alabama Coalition Against Domestic Violence serves as the statewide professional association representing Alabama's 18 certified domestic violence shelters. Our shelters provide emergency shelter, crisis counseling, clothes, food, court assistance, job training, and a host of other critical services for the women and children who flee violent homes. Thanks to the hard work of Alabama's domestic violence shelters, victims and their children are able to obtain safety and life-saving services that often lead to a violence free future. While our state has made significant progress, there is still much to be done because domestic violence continues to be the number one cause of injury for Alabama women.

During the month of October, I am hosting a Candlelight Vigil on the Capitol steps along with a luncheon. The Capitol, State House and Governor's Mansion will have purple lights the first week as well as purple bows on their doors the entire month. I will unveil a restructured and rebranded ACADV as well as a four-year plan to make Alabama's domestic violence services the best in the country.

We will only be able to prevent domestic violence in our communities with the commitment of our leaders. I hope you will join me in this effort by signing the attached resolution and placing purple bows on the doors of your City Halls. Awareness is key in turning victims into survivors and making Alabama homes safe.
